But what is seen by the great Breigel as an overcoming of fear of "black holes" of travels into the hereafter, the art created by Elena Zolotnitsky becomes cinematographical (the age of cinema) reproduction of the dream with the absurdity of the conscious, where the splashes of ante-everlasting memory of a blessed world interchange with lapses into the unconscious of the yawning abyss created by Jean Pascal Blaise.


Dmitri Strizhov's
